Budget

The main income of the Council is the precept (community charge). The precept for 2022-23 was £11,286. The precept is collected by the county council as part of council tax bills. The council also received a one off payment of £8,370.37 following the dissolution of Llangattock Vibon Avel Community Council.

The Council's expenditure is mainly as follows:-

- Clerk Salary
- Members allowances
- Maintenance of Llanvihangel-Ystern-Llewern and Llangattock Vibon Avel (closed part) churchyards.
- Maintenance of IT systems
- Donations to local groups

A full breakdown of the expenditure incurred for this financial year will be available in the annual accounts once approved.

Relationship With Monmouthshire County Council

The Council works closely with the County Councillor Ian Chandler who represents Llantilio Crossenny ward which includes the communities of Whitecastle and Skenfrith. Cllr. Chandler attends community council meetings and is supportive in dealing with queries from the residents in relation to services, road conditions and any issues affecting residents.

Training Plan

The Council is a member of One Voice Wales and most training will be undertaken via them. A training plan will be published later in the year.

Audit

Accounts ending 31 March 2023 will be subject to an Internal Audit by an appointed professional person and also an external audit by the Auditor General for Wales. The outcome of all Audits will be published on the Council's website.
